# Regulation for Selecting University Council Member Representing the College of Liberal Arts, National Cheng Kung University 

Approved on September $28^{\text {th }}, 2006$ in the $1^{\text {st }}$ College Council Meeting of the $1^{\text {st }}$ Semester of the Academic Year 2006
Amended and approved on December $25^{\text {th }}, 2012$ in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ College Council Meeting of the $1^{\text {st }}$ Semester of the Academic Year

Amended and approved on September $18^{\text {th }}, 2014$ in the $1^{\text {st }}$ College Council Meeting of the $1^{\text {st }}$ Semester of the Academic Year

Article 1 Regulations for the selection of College representatives to the University Council (hereinafter referred to as these Regulations) have been formulated according to Clause 6 of Article 14 of the NCKU Organizational Regulations.

Article 2 The number of College representatives to the University Council are determined by the ratio distributed to the College.

Article 3 The representatives to the University Council from the College shall be composed of the following persons:

1. Ex officio representative: The Dean.
2. Selected Representatives:
(1) Each department (institute) recommends candidates from its full-time faculty members. With every five full-time faculty members, the department (institute) is entitled to recommend one person. At least two people should be recommended. Among them, those who also serve as administrators (not including the Dean) should be one at most.
(2) The College Council meeting holds a ballot-casting on the candidates recommended by all departments (institutes), the ones with the highest numbers of ballots are the representatives. Each department (institute) has to have at least one representative. Among the representatives, professors and associate professors combined should be no less than two-thirds of all representatives.
(3) Candidates who have obtained the same number of votes shall be decided by drawing lots at the College Council meeting by the department (institute) heads to decide on the order of priority.
(4) The maximum number of representatives who are concurrently serving as administrators (including the dean) shall not exceed the upper limit set by the University. The limits are adjustable according to the ballots obtained.

Article 4 The elected representatives, if, for any reason, cannot serve the positions as representatives to the University Council, they shall be replaced by the personnel recommended by the departments (institutes) they are from.

Article 5 These regulations are filed with the University and implemented after being approved by the College Council.
