# Regulations for the establishment of <<Drama Program>> of National Cheng Kung University

semester in the Academic Year 2014.

Article 1 National Cheng Kung University (hereinafter referred to as the University) aims to cultivate students with professional ability in the field of drama According to the guidelines for the establishment of cross-disciplinary credit courses in the university, the "Program of Drama" (briefly referred to in the following as the Program).

Article 2 This course is a cross-departmental credited program, which is jointly organized by the College of Liberal Arts of the University. The Dean of Liberal Arts shall serve as the coordinator of the program and may appoint one full-time faculty member (assistant professor or above) to be the Chief Executive Officer and coordinates the implementation of all matters of this Program.

Article 3 The Curriculum Committee of this Program is composed of 4 to 7 committee members. They are in charge of the evaluation of the courses in this program and matters related to the development. Each term is two years and one can consecutively serve another term.

Article 4 Students have to take at least 15 credits in this program. Basic Courses: fundamental knowledge of this program that lays the foundation; no less than 4 credits. Advanced Courses: deepens and expands extensively professional qualities and training course in this Program; no less than 6 credits.

Article 5 The courses of this program include three major areas: drama, opera, and cross-cultural (category) theater, as well as and the names of the courses and credits assigned. Please see the details in the announcement on the website of the Program of Drama (College of Liberal Arts) in each academic year. The Curriculum Committee
of this Program shall coordinate every year the courses offered by the departments for the students to take. If there is any doubt regarding the recognition of courses in this Program, it may be discussed by the Curriculum Committee.

Article 6 Comprehensive forums (or workshops) may be offered in this Program, with 2 to 3 credits for each workshop. It will be a systematic approach to strengthen students' professional knowledge, literacy and training among relevant courses of this Program.

Article 7 The recognition of relevant courses from departments (institutes) from other colleges shall be approved by the Curriculum Committee of this Program before they can be recognized as credited courses of the Program.

Article 8 This course shall plan, if necessary, for students' off-campus internships, which shall be coordinated and implemented by the program curriculum committee, including off-campus professional internship courses or academic-industrial offcampus internships, the selection and signing of internship cooperation contracts with collaborative institutions, distribution of students to internship units, evaluation of the effectiveness of students' off-campus internships, and negotiation on appeals regarding students' rights and interests in off-campus internships and other matters related to the protection of rights and interests.

Students who wish to enroll shall apply to the Program of Drama first. Having completed the required credits of this Program with passing grades, students may submit transcripts of the attending years and an application form and apply for the issuing of a program completion certificate. The certificate will be issued after evaluation of this curriculum committee after being approved.

Article 10 Matters not covered $t=$ in these regulations will be handles with related laws and regulations.

Article 11 These regulations have been approved by the College curriculum committee and have been raised with the University curriculum committee for approval and implementation. The same shall apply when amended.
